### LITTER FINES FOR LOSE GARBAGE

### ELM TREE PRUNING BAN

### ANNUAL NOTICE TO CONSUMER

The Town of Preeceville is required by the Ministry of Environment to provide water consumers with a drinking water quality and compliance report each year. This reports states the quality of water produced and supplied by the town as well as information on the performance of the waterworks in submitting samples as required by the Minister's Order or Permit to Operate a waterworks. The Town's 2008 report has been compiled and is now available for pick up at the Town Office.

### GRASS CLIPPINGS

Avoid scattering grass clippings and yard debris on to the streets and sidewalks. Grass clippings and yard debris on the streets will cause the sewer drains to become clogged.

### NO PARKING SIGN

Please take note that Town Council has passed a bylaw which designates the area between 206 and 222 Highway Ave. E as a "No Parking" Zone. This area is located on the north side of the street across from Midtown Service. This area was designated as no parking to ensure the safety of motorists crossing Highway Ave East from 2<sup>nd</sup> Street NE. All vehicle operators are encourage to obey the new no parking area or fines may be imposed.

### TOURIST BOOTH

The Tourist Booth is now open from Monday to Saturday from 10:00 am – 12:30 pm and from 1:30 pm - 4:00 pm. ### ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES

It is illegal to operate any unlicensed vehicle such as ATV's on public property and on private property without the owner's permission. Public property includes the Town Air Strip, vacant lots, ditches, streets, back alleys and parks. If you see someone violating theses rules please contact the RCMP.

### SARCAN RECYCLING HOLIDAY HOURS

The Sarcan Recycling Centre will be closed from July 13<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup> and again from August 3<sup>rd</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> for holidays. During these times there will be no Recycling Services.
