OFFICE AND SHOP HOLIDAY HOURS

ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES

It is illegal to operate any unlicensed vehicle such as ATV's on public property and on private property without the owner's permission. GARBAGE PICK UP

Please be reminded that as of May 1st, 2010 anyone who regularly moves their garbage from the front to the back alley for pick up is required to do so until October 31st, 2010 regardless of the amount of snow we have received. This change will take effect at these times each year.

A reminder that the Elm tree pruning ban began on April 1st and will continue through to August 31st as it does each year to prevent the spread of Dutch Elm disease.
