ELM TREE PRUNING BAN

The Elm Tree Pruning Ban began April 1st and will continue until August 31st this year to prevent the spread of Dutch elm disease. Fresh cuts from pruning attracts the beetles that can spread the disease, which increases the chances of infection. SECURING LOADS OF GARBAGE

Please be reminded to insure that all loads being taken to the landfill are secured down and all bags or bins are securely closed. If some of the waste does happen to fall out of your vehicle, please stop and pick it up. Thank you in advance for your help in keeping our community clean.

BUSINESS LICENSES

All Town of Preeceville Business Licenses expired on December 31st, 2008. Please ensure your license is renewed for 2009. Not obtaining a license is an offense under the bylaw of the Town. The fee for business licenses is \$200 per year or \$50 per year if your business had gross revenues of \$5,000 or less.

ECO CENTRE NOW OPEN

The Preeceville ECO Centre has opened for the season on Tuesday, May 5th, 2009. Bring in all of your used oil, oil filters and oil containers you have been saving up through the winter. The ECO Center will be open every Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday from 8 am to 12 noon. Help protect your environment by recycling your used oils.

TOWN OFFICE AND SHOP HOURS

The Town Office and Shop will be closed on May 18th, 2009 for Victoria Day. Regular office hours will resume Tuesday, May 19th, 2009 from 8:00 am to 12:00 noon and 1:00 pm to 5:00 pm, Monday to Friday (excluding holidays).

FIRE PIT INSPECTIONS

Please be reminded that if you are planning to build a fire pit in your back yard this spring, all fire pits used within Town are required to be inspected. To sign up for an inspection please contact the Town Office with your request by the end of July.

2009 DOG LICENSES

Please be reminded that all dogs in Town must be licensed for 2009. Cost is \$10.00 for each female and \$5.00 for each male or spayed female.

DAYCARE ATTEMPT FOR AREA

The Family Resource Centre is looking for your help. It has been requested of the Department of Early Learning and Child Care that a licensed daycare facility be put up in our area. While the request is being processed, there are a few further steps which need to be taken. If you are interested in doing some of the leg work required to get this venture off the ground contact Chris at the Family Resource Centre @1-306-548-5478. Some required tasks include; finding and securing a feasible location; surveying the specific needs in regard to ages of children requiring daycare as well as, development of a non-profit corporation. If this venture is approved, the facility would need to be up and running no later than March 31, 2010.

FIREWORKS PERMIT

With summer holiday activities and Canada Day long weekend celebrations being planned please be reminded that to display fireworks a permit is required. The permits are issued by the Preeceville Volunteer Fire Department and are used to ensure fireworks are used in a safe location where no fires may be started. GRASS CLIPPINGS

Avoid scattering grass clippings and yard debris on to the streets and sidewalks. Grass clippings and yard debris on the streets will cause the sewer drains to become clogged.

ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES

It is illegal to operate any unlicensed vehicle such as ATV's on public property and on private property without the owner's permission. Public property includes the Town Air Strip, vacant lots, ditches, streets, back alleys and parks. If you see someone violating these rules please contact the RCMP.

ABANDONED RAIL LINE

Please be advised that the Town of Preeceville is now the owner of the abandoned CN Rail Line property running through town and removal of any material from the property is prohibited.
