Preeceville electors may be going to the polls to vote on Wednesday, October 28<sup>th</sup>, 2009. Call for Nominations opens on September 17<sup>th</sup>, 2009 with the Nomination day closing on September 30<sup>th</sup>, 2009 at 4:00 p.m. If a poll is necessary, advanced voting will be held at the Preeceville & District Integrated Health Care Facility, Nursing Home Side, on October 24<sup>th</sup>, 2009 from 2 p.m. – 4 p.m. and regular voting will be held at the Town of Preeceville Council Chambers, 239 Highway Avenue East, from 9:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m. on October 28<sup>th</sup>, 2009.

### FALL CLEAN-UP WEEK

September 20<sup>th</sup> to 26<sup>th</sup>, 2009 has been designated as fall clean up week. During this week on the days the landfill is open (Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday) site entry will be free. As well, the garbage truck will be making an extra trip around town on Friday, September 25<sup>th</sup> to pick up yard debris such as bagged leaves, grass clippings and bundled sticks/branches.

### PLASTIC BAG RECYCLING

The Parkland Regional Waste Management Authority is pleased to announce that they are now recycling plastic bags. Plastic bags may be collected and once you have filled a plastic bag full of bags it may be placed in any paper recycling blue bin. Please ensure collected bags are bundled and not thrown loosely in the bins. GREEN or BLACK bags are NOT recyclable at this point. Only clear, white or other colour plastic bags are accepted, green or black garbage bags are not accepted.

### ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES

It is illegal to operate any unlicensed vehicle such as ATV's on public property and on private property without the owner's permission. Public property includes the Town Air Strip, vacant lots, ditches, streets, back alleys and parks. If you see someone creating a disturbance please contact the RCMP.
